Relevance of Topic: Twitter is an exceptional platform for not only our own professional development, but for that of our students. The students and/or educators can develop their own hashtags/platforms/chats for their classrooms and create questions and answer sessions, LIVE, that are truly relevant and meaningful to *them*. If used correctly and consistently, it can be a tool for sustainable and personalized PD.

- 4. Ways to use Twitter for Student/Educator Engagement:
 - Ongoing personalized PD. You can search various topics of interest and participate in chats—you do not have to host to get the benefits.
 - Increase your Professional Learning Network (PLN)
 - Be able to have relevant, meaningful, and professional conversations with people in your field all of the world
 - Create your own chat and then have students moderate and create weekly question and answer sessions
 - Find and participate in research topics (for assignments/activities)
 - Broaden your school's reach by incorporating OC's hashtag and tweet exciting activities that are going on in your classroom
